NO AL TRABAJO INFANTIL, ¡SÍ A LA EDUCACIÓN!

Vocational programs in Nicaragua provide long-lasting benefits to entire families.

When you step into the classroom at one of the vocational programs offered at Las Tías, you find young adults and women from the community who are enthusiastic about learning new skills and building financial resilience. These future bakers, beauticians and carpenters are investing in their own futures AND the future of their families, a fact highlighted by Candida Mendez, Co-founder & Executive Director of Las Tías when she spoke at our recent Fall Gala.

Students take these vocational courses for anywhere from 6 months to multiple years. Once they are able to demonstrate mastery of their skills, they officially graduate from the program. Support from the Spark community has allowed Las Tías to purchase graduation gifts that reward hard work and help individuals leverage their new skills into income generating businesses - i.e. sewing machines for the sewing class graduates and carpentry tools for the woodworking graduates.







In the vocational classes we offer, students learn skills that open up job opportunities and help entrepreneurs start their own businesses. Their income has a huge impact on financial and family sustainability, including a reduction in child labor as parents earn more and send their children to school. At Las Tías we say "no al trabajo infantil, jsí a la educación!" (no to child labor, yes to education!)

THE SPARK INSPIRATION LAB IN PRACTICE

We Grow Chicago's Peace Campus Director, Heavy Crownz, provides an update on how the computer lab is empowering West Englewood students.

In 2020, Spark Ventures & the Dewan Foundation partnered with We Grow Chicago to create the Spark Inspiration Lab which is fulfilling a long-time need in West Englewood. With more than 70% of residents without an internet connection in their homes, the computer lab opens up significant educational and job opportunities.

At our Fall Gala, we heard directly from Heavy Crownz, We Grow Chicago's Peace Campus Director, who shared specific examples on how the We Grow community is making use of the lab on a daily basis:

- Our partner Teamwork Englewood's parent mentor program uses the lab to facilitate computer skills training for parent volunteers.
- The "art of digital expression" program teaches teens how to navigate Google Suites through a creative & entrepreneurial lens to increase organization, productivity and overall professionalism. They also get hands-on experience with dj-ing and social media content creation.
- The lab is also an ever-evolving safe space for our all-boy BEARS book club that fosters a love of reading through brotherhood, connecting boys with male speakers who inspire them to build strong character and use reading to explore their imagination.

Programs like these empower students to chase their dreams and give them the tools to make their futures bright.
