
### OUR MISSION

## stories of impact



#### WINJI hope community school

"I grew up in Twapia with my twin sister. After my father passed away, my mother worked odd jobs but couldn't afford school fees. In 2017, we were accepted into Hope Community School, which changed my life. I worked hard, became a prefect, and in 2023, achieved the best Grade 7 exam results in Hope's history. This earned me a place at Hillcrest National STEM Secondary School, one of Zambia's top schools. My dream is to become a radiologist - I am fascinated by how machines can reveal what is hidden inside the human body, and how doctors can use that information to save lives. I'm grateful to Hope Community School and Spark Ventures for helping me see that with hard work and faith, anything is possible. Education is truly the equalizer."



ELENA SARAHÍ asociacion las Tias

Elena Sarahí is the youngest of three and lives with her mother, grandfather, and brother in a relative's house, which they care for in exchange for a place to stay. She's a 5th grader and joined the youth program at Las Tias this past year. Her mother sought support from Las Tías because Elena Sarahí struggled with reading and writing, and her mother, unable to read herself, couldn't provide the help needed. She lost her father when she was 10 years old. Despite these challenges, she is focused on her education (where her favorite subject is math) and she dreams of becoming a doctor to help children. Elena Sarahí enjoys making crafts and through the piñata-making course, she has improved her skills and plans to sell piñatas from home to support her mother.



ITCHEL entreamigos

Itchel, a 10-year-old in 5th grade, joined the Jungle Group at Entreamigos to learn how to manage her anxiety and safely express her emotions after facing challenges at school and in group activities. With the support of the program, Itchel developed healthy communication skills, which improved her participation, confidence, and academic performance, ultimately earning her a spot in the Scholarship Program. Her favorite subject is math, and she enjoys gymnastics, circus, Girl Scouts, and emotional intelligence classes at Entreamigos. She lives with her mom, Lili, her brother Itzael, and her dog. She loves playing with friends, taking fun classes, and drawing.

"The financial literacy course [offered in the Spark Inspiration Lab] was truly transformative because it revealed that my dream of financial freedom is not as distant as I once thought. ### JOINING HANDS TO LEARN FROM EACH OTHER

impact travel experiences continue to successfully build connections

Our work is anchored by an impact travel program that builds life-changing connections between our stakeholder and partner communities. Travelers return from these experiences invigorated by the connections made, with the reality of the impact we are having crystallized by seeing it first hand. Our partner organizations benefit from direct investments that happen as a result of the trips, including the time and expertise shared by those who visit.

#### MEXICO | february

Our trip to Mexico this year incorporated feedback from both travelers and Entreamigos alike that more opportunities for connection with the young students in the Jungle Group would be meaningful for everyone. We were able to engage in an interactive experience and helped sponsor a field trip to a coffee plantation where travelers and students were treated to a

#### CHICAGO May

This year marked another successful installation of Unity Day at We Grow Chicago. Twenty eight Spark supporters joined over one hundred others in West Englewood for "The Largest Community Clean-Up in Chicago." Spark not only brought volunteers to the event, but also served as financial sponsors - leveraging our support into a community event that brings people in the neighborhood together for the collective good. Our team helped paint a mural that beautified the block - it was an impressive transformation.





### ZAMBIA juły

In July, we partnered with a dedicated group of 18 educators and travelers from Chicago and Kansas City to bring a week of transformative learning experiences to the students at Hope in Zambia. Carefully crafted lessons aligned with the Zambian curriculum and focused on STEM, ELA, and computer studies, while activities like pinwheel experiments and "game show" guizzes brought texts like The Boy Who Harnessed the Wind to life. The classrooms buzzed with energy as educators introduced innovative teaching methods. Students also explored real-world math concepts such as budgeting and profit, participated in book clubs featuring stories of change-makers, and engaged in hands-on science experiments in Hope's new science lab.



### A FOLLOW UP: CHICKENS (and so much more!) IN ZAMBIA

Long-time supporters of Spark Ventures will remember that poultry farming has been part of the sustainability strategy for our friends at Hope Community School for many years. As far back as 2011 we were working with our Zambian partners to strengthen and expand their entrepreneurial capabilities, launching a chicken farm in Zambia's capital city of Lusaka. Chicken farming is not without challenges and in the intervening years the area where the Lusaka farm was located industrialized significantly (making it quite inhospitable to fragile baby chicks). In 2018 Hope purchased farmland much closer to their school campus in Twapia. The 25 acre farm has blossomed in the past years with all sorts of vegetables (from cabbage to corn to tomatoes) that supplement the meal program at Hope Community School and provide





additional revenue. In the past year the Hope Farm has added robustly to what they cultivate - this includes leveraging their existing knowledge about poultry farming, but also new and exciting adventures like tilapia ponds, goats and rabbits. Students visit the farm to learn agricultural skills and additional roles at the farm provide employment in the local Twapia community. The farm is fully sustainable, with the revenue covering labor (including two full-time farm workers), feed, equipment, seeds/seedlings, maintenance, animal care, etc. The additional profits help subsidize Hope Community School's expenses, covering the cost of the tailor who provides vocational training programs, and a portion of the salaries for six of Hope's secondary school teachers!



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
