HOPE COMMUNITY SCHOOL POWERS UP

Solar Energy & Starlink Internet Bring Powerful Connectivity

For years, Hope Community School in Zambia has been a beacon of education and opportunity for children in the Twapia community. But in the past year, the school faced a major challenge—Zambia, which relies heavily on hydroelectric power, was hit by severe drought, leading to blackouts lasting up to 21 hours a day. These outages had a serious impact on public health, limiting the amount of running water accessible in an area where cholera outbreaks are a persistent risk. Hope was forced to use a gas-powered generator for their water pump, at significant cost. They also disrupted classrooms that were just beginning to regularly leverage computers and projectors in their teaching. Thanks to the generous support of the John & Susan Dewan Foundation, Hope Community School now has a game-changing solution: solar power. This upgrade ensures reliable, uninterrupted, cost-effective electricity, bringing much-needed stability to daily operations as well as a leap in the direction of environmental and organizational sustainability.





And the good news doesn't stop there-Hope Community School has also been connected to **Starlink internet**, providing a fast, stable connection at a much lower price. Previously, unreliable internet made it difficult to take full advantage of the myriad of technology investments Spark has made over the past few years, but now students and teachers have better access to online resources. educational tools, and connections with our ever-growing roster of tutors who Zoom in regularly to provide educational enhancement.

These advancements represent more than just modern conveniences—they are a lifeline for learning and growth. With solar energy and Starlink reducing costs and opening new doors, Hope Community School is poised for a brighter, more sustainable future.









A NEW APPROACH TO INCLUSION IN MEXICO

Updates to the "Jungle Group" program promote belonging

Our partner in Mexico shares our deep belief that every child deserves the opportunity to learn in a supportive, inclusive environment. In alignment with this value, Entreamigos has made an important change that Spark has fully supported: the program formerly known as the "Jungle Group" is now integrated into their general scholarship program.

The decision to unify the program came after coordinators noticed instances of bullying between students in the two groups. To create a **more inclusive and supportive learning environment**, all students are now recognized simply as scholarship students. This shift by Entreamigos promotes equity, removes labels, and fosters a sense of belonging among all participants.

Though distinctions are no longer visible, support remains strong - the Jungle Group was a subset of students who were identified as needing extra behavioral and academic help. Instead of grouping these students separately, Entreamigos has now implemented a rubric system to address their needs within a blended classroom.

This approach ensures all students learn together while **those facing challenges can continue to receive targeted support**. Spark Ventures continues to support Entreamigos in providing resources for these students to thrive.

By fostering equality and understanding, we strengthen every child's foundation for success.

"When I joined Hope Community School 18 years ago, we had 70 learners in a rented building, with no resources for teachers, supplies, or even meals. But we had one thing, hope. With that hope and support from people like you, we have transformed our school into a fully developed campus providing education, healthcare, and meals to over 550 learners. Milestones like achieving test scores 17% higher than the national averages, becoming a national examination center for Grade Nine, retaining nearly all our teachers, and strengthening the reading culture in our library have further cemented Hope as a leading institution in Zambia." -Head Teacher Ng'oma (Guest speaker at this year's Spring Forward Event)
